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THREADED AND BOSTON COLLEGE COLLABORATE ON FUNDRAISING CLOTHING DRIVE

BOSTON — On Wednesday, Nov. 15, 2023 ThreadED joined forces with Boston College's student-led green organization EcoPledge, on a campus-wide clothing donation drive. Throughout the donation process, EcoPledge and ThreadED place donation bins throughout the Boston College campus, which allows students to donate their clothes based on their availability. Donation bins are available in the 66 Commonwealth Avenue Residential Building and Duchesne (East and West) residential building from Nov. 15 through Thanksgiving break. Collected clothes are sorted and donated to ThreadED, which are then resold with the funds used to assist students in completing their education.

"I think Gail [Harris] and I work very much in collaboration on this program. Also, I am very interested in volunteers and interns to help grow the organization and bring in fresh ideas and skills," said Laurel Sgan, Co-Founder of ThreadED, Fashion for a Future.

While ThreadED is trying to overcome the financial barrier of higher education, EcoPledge is trying to maximize the awareness of eco-friendliness. Through the donation drive, ThreadED has sent over 70 students to academic institutions. Although the scholarship covers the financial gaps between financial aid and college tuition, the scholarship amounts are up to \$1,500. It helps numerous students overcome financial hardships.

CLOTHING DRIVE FOR GOOD CAUSE WITH THE RELATED COMPANY

BOSTON — On Thursday, Sept. 21, 2023. ThreadED is running donation drives with seven upscale apartment complexes. This donation drive allowed ThreadED to send students to universities to complete their undergraduate programs. The organization helps and supports students through scholarships to fill the financial gap between academic institutions and financial aid.

For October, ThreadED is collecting donations from luxury apartment complexes in Back Bay, South End, and Waterfront in the Boston area. While the residents donated their clothes or accessories, it was the first time that ThreadED produced and executed this kind of big project. This ThreadED pilot project is one of the first donation drives between a luxury apartment and a local nonprofit organization. The sales of donated clothing continued to fund students through ThreadED and other academic nonprofits in Massachusetts.

"Just before the pandemic, ThreadED had launched a pilot program working with colleges and student groups to run clothing drives on nearby campuses. This partnership with the Related Companies is enabling us to use that model with a different and upscale audience," says Laurel Sgan, Co-Founder of ThreadED, Fashion for a Future.
